NCCER Electrical Level 1 This NCCER electrical certification shows that candidates understand basic electrical theory, wiring methods and safety practices essential for any entry-level electrical technician role. The credential tests knowledge in topics like DC/AC theory, electrical drawings, device boxes and conduit bending. Candidates should also be familiar with blueprints and the National Electrical Code (NEC) standards—skills that are crucial on real job sites.
