## Scales chords and arpeggios

This is when the strummed chord progressions involve fast shifting among chord and arpeggios, since they normally involve fewer tones, are more suitable for playing over different chord in a dynamic fashion (i.e., not using a single scale over all or majority of chords). Perfect fifth (5), diminished (b5) or augmented (#5). Don't be overwhelmed by all of the shapes at once. Some of Sweep picking's biggest pioneers include Yngwie Malmsteen, Frank Gambale, Bruce Boulet, and Jason Becker . Shapes that are just a bit more symmetrical. This shape feels best played with a 1-3-1-4 finger combo. But sometimes specific shapes can be advantageous for some chord types. Dominant 9th two-octave pattern The fingerboard diagram below shows a dominant 9th arpeggio with the first root note on the 6th string (Note that the 3rd is omitted). Once again, the shape is movable. Arpeggios can be classified into several families : Triad Arpeggios (made of three notes) as maj, min, aug, sus4, sus2, and diminished. These are many possible shapes for arpeggio concerning these chord and scale types. This minor 7th arpeggio shape is the same as the ones on the 2nd and 3rd degrees of the scale. Major Major 7th two-octave pattern The fingerboard diagram below shows a Cmaj7 arpeggio with the first root note on the 6th string (root notes in dark blue color). The shape is movable and can be used for all Minor 7th chords. So, let's get the rest of the shapes up: The fingering here is the same as the last shape. This mean that they can match the chords (e.g., played by another guitarist, the rhythm guitar) to a higher degree. Arpeggios are used in virtually every type of music and played on every musical instrument, most notably the piano, guitar, and violin. Arpeggios can be seen as "scales without passing notes". We have 3 of the same minor 7, and then 2 remaining rogue shapes that include Dom7 and M7b5. Instead of the boring old CAGED guitar shapes like the ones above, let's spread these out 2-note-per-string, and over a larger portion of the fretboard. This chord involves two octaves in its theoretical form, but to be suited for arpeggios the ninth are moved one octave back. Remember, you get 2 of the same Major 7 shapes. Diatonic arpeggios are sequences of notes taken from the parent scale, typically consisting of the 1st (root), 3rd, and 5th notes of the scale, and can also extending to the 7th, 9th, or beyond. Adding 7ths will drastically change the sound of arpeggios as well as new tonal sounds in the key you're improvising in. An arpeggio is a musical term that indicates that notes of a chord are to be played in succession, rather than simultaneously. It makes them a safer choice in this lead guitar context, but they may lack some of the melodic richness that can be accomplished by using scales. Alternatively, you could try 1-3-1-4 if that is more comfortable. Arpeggios are identical with chords, what differs is the application. The chosen once are plausible alternatives and by purpose shapes that are similar for different chord types have been chosen to make it easier to memorize and compare. While chords can be strummed (vertically), arpeggios involve patterns which can include more than one tone per string. Also, to stick with the four-note pattern, the fifth is omitted. Remember, we're just starting a new arpeggio on each note of the C Major scale. With these 2 note per string shapes, sweep picking isn't really a practical way to play these. Thus giving different types of arpeggios such as : Major 7 ( 1 3 5 7) Minor 7 ( 1 b3 5 b7) Dominant 7 ( 1 3 5 b7) Half-dminished ( 1 b3 b5 b7) Diminished ( 1 b3 b5 bb7) Augmented 7 ( 1 3 #5 b7) Major 7#5 ( 1 3 #5 7) Minor / Major 7 ( 1 b3 5 7) These arpeggios can be extended with supplementary notes above the octave as ninth, eleventh and thirteenth. Instead of playing all the notes of a chord at once, you play them one after the other, usually from the lowest to the highest or vice versa. The main types of arpeggios are built with four notes : Root (1). Furthermore, the good news, is there are only 3 shapes to memorize in any given key: Major, minor, and diminished. They can be played separately or together with scales in improvisation situations. The major 9th is another chord that lends itself to arpeggios.
