Signs are an investment in the health of your workforce. The importance of safety signs in the workplace cannot be understated. If hazards are present, safety signs and tags must be posted. Safety signs and symbols come under many categories, but they can usually be divided into two major types based on their intentions a) For general safety protocolsb) For labeling hazardous and toxic elementsBased on that, weve further divided safety signs and symbols into seven different types that can be seen everywhere around you e.g. in transportation, workplaces, construction sites, public places, etc.Lets see what each of these symbols mean in detail.Types of Safety Signs1. Prohibition SignsThey forbid behaviors that may cause danger to not only one individual but also to other occupants in that area as well.Prohibition signs usually contain DO NOT commands to restrict people from doing something in a certain area that may result in an unwanted scenario. Their examples include NO ENTRY, NO EATING/DRINKING, NO SMOKING, or DO NOT USE.They are usually displayed as a black imagery of the prohibiting behavior or action on a white background with a red circle around the imagery and a diagonal line at a 45-degree angle through the red circle.2. Warning signsWarning signs are used to warn about an action or an object thats a hazard. They are commonly seen to generate awareness of a nearby danger source e.g. a combustible liquid store or a slippery surface.They usually have a black imagery of the particular hazard/danger inside a black equilateral triangle on a yellow background. The texts in the warning boards are in black.3. Mandatory signsMandatory signs command a specific action that must be followed in certain circumstances. They are used for such commands as Do This, You Must, or Obey to protect people from possible dangers where precautions are needed.They appear as a white imagery or symbol and text within a white frame. These mandatory signs can also appear with just a single word without any symbol or imagery. The words are written in black on a rectangular white background.4. Danger signsThese signs are used to warn people about life-threatening conditions. Workplaces that have high-powered machinery, high voltages, acid, and volatile compounds are bound to use danger signs.These signs contain the word DANGER written in white color inside a red oval on a black surface.5. Fire signsFire signs give information about fire hazards and fire-fighting equipment around you. These signs allow you to act quickly and prevent spreading of fire when a fire breaks out.Theyre placed near fire hoses, fire blankets, and other related equipment.Fire Signs are rectangular or square in shape with a white imagery or text on a red background.6. Emergency signsEmergency signs are used to give information about directions to or locations of different emergency facilities that are supposed to be used when something goes wrong.Signs like FIRST AID KIT, EMERGENCY EXIT or EMERGENCY PHONE can be categorized into emergency signs.They appear as a green square or rectangle shape with white imagery and text in the middle. Similar to mandatory signs, they can also appear with just a word.7. Restriction SignsThese signs are used to indicate limits on a specific activity like speed limit, height limit, vehicle weight or other parameters.They have limit numbers written in black inside a red circle on a white background.FAQs1. Lets talk more about these signs and why they are so crucial to the overall safety of your workforce. High voltage, dangerous chemicals, radiation these are all examples of danger signs. Danger signs are the most serious safety sign types defined by OSHA. Danger signs are to be displayed in areas where immediate hazards and risk are (or may be) present. These signs have a distinct shape, color scheme, and have the word Danger printed within a red rectangle on the top of the sign. Caution signs is the second OSHA-official sign category. This sign type is an accident prevention tag, indicating situations that may result in minor to moderate injuries. There are two main design rules that signify caution signs. First, caution signs should contain the command word Caution in all-caps with all-black text. Second, caution signage is typically printed on a yellow panel background in an inverted triangle panel shape with a black exclamation mark next to the Caution command word. The third type of OSHA safety sign category is general safety. General safety signs serve as a reminder of workplace safety rules, best practices, and can direct employees to emergency equipment if needed.General safety signs use text and pictograms printed in either green or black on a plain white background or white on a green background. This type of safety sign is broad and multifunctional. Workplaces should install general safety signage when any of the following are present:First aid kitsSanitation stationsEmergency phonesSafety apparel required Several smaller categories of safety signs include: Safety instruction signs inform workers about workplace safety policies and procedures. This may include shutdown instructions, hygiene practices, or how to operate certain types of equipment. How can you recognize these signs? You can identify a safety instruction sign by the white background with a green upper panel and white lettering. Admittance signs detail who can and cannot enter a certain designated area. These signs clearly stand out and use phrases such as do not enter, no trespassing, authorized personnel only, or similar messaging. Fire safety signs identify areas of mandatory fire precaution or prohibition. Fire safety signs have white lettering and fire graphics on a bright red background. There are two types of compliant fire signage:1: Prohibitory fire signs: These are specific prohibition signs stating that no open flames are allowed.2: Emergency fire fighting equipment: These signs designate where fire fighting equipment is stored, such as fire extinguishers, blankets, smoke masks, and hoses.Unlike many other safety signs, fire signage does not require a headline such as Caution or Warning. These signs are typically located near fire alarms, though this is not a requirement. Non-hazard signs include workplace traffic signs and safety area directional information. These signs communicate general safety messages such as the nearest exits points and fire assembly points.
