March 24, 2023 / 7:32 AM EDT / CBS Boston BOSTON - A man from Virginia says the Registry of Motor Vehicles is forcing him to register his car in Massachusetts even though he doesn't live or work here. That story led several WBZ-TV viewers to reach out with their own frustrations about the registry. What are the laws in Massachusetts for out of state drivers? The RMV says under chapter 90, section 3 of state law "no motor vehicle or trailer shall be operated on more than thirty days in the aggregate in any one year." In other words, anyone who uses a vehicle in Massachusetts for 30 days of the year for any reason is required to register their vehicle here. That's what's happening to Ben, the driver from Virginia. His visited Boston for a month, the RMV found out about it and threatened to suspend his license if he didn't dual register. Another viewer asked - what about out of state college students with registrations from other states? Under the same law, it says college students have to file a nonresident drivers' statement to the police department with their out of state registration information and insurance during the school year. If they don't, they could face a \$200 fine. Boston University student Chris Tin is from Washington state and has his car at school. He said the long wait times at the registry make the situation even worse. "Sometimes the next available day would be in like two months or one month and a half, so I don't think it's very practical," he told WBZ. "I think it's kind of ridiculous," said Johnnie Parker, a registered driver in Texas. "It sounds just like a money grab." A registry spokesperson told WBZ they are looking into the questions. Converting a Driver's License from a Foreign Country However, if you are a foreign visitor with a valid license from one of the countries or territories approved by the RMV, you may legally drive in Massachusetts for up to one year. Do I have to take a road test to transfer my license in MA? If your license has been expired more than 1 year, a full test (written and road) and an eye test will be required. If your license is active or is expired for less than 1 year, a written and road test is not required. To transfer your license, you must have a valid immigration status for at least 12 months. Can I get my mass drivers license online? Review the enclosed checklist and have your document ready. Visit the RMV's Online Service Center and select your renewal transaction then follow the prompts to verify your identity and start your transaction. Choose Standard Massachusetts driver's license and follow the prompts to complete your transaction online. How much does a Massachusetts license cost? For a license, it will be \$10.00 per year. For a Mass ID, it will be \$5.00 per year. In Massachusetts, driving school or driver's training is required if you're under 18 years old. Driver's training will either be included as part of your driver's education course or will be something that you need to enroll in separately. If you are required to complete driving school to get your license, the course will consist of 12 hours of behind-the-wheel training and 6 hours of observation. In Massachusetts a non commercial driver's license costs \$50. The cost of the Massachusetts driving test is \$35. Driver's license restriction codes may be added to your license to indicate you are only allowed to drive under certain circumstances or are eligible for certain types of driving. Z: No Full Air Brake Equipped CMV. If you hold a provisional driver's license in Massachusetts, the following rules will apply: No passengers under 18 years old other than siblings. No driving between 12:30 am and 5 am. The minimum driving age requirements in Massachusetts are: Learner's Permit: 16 Provisional License: 16 1/2 Driver's License: 18 The Massachusetts driving log is something new drivers in the graduated driver licensing (GDL) program will need to fill out as part of their supervised driving practice requirements when they hold a learner's permit. The driving log will typically need to be completed by the parents or legal guardians and submitted before taking your road test. Teen drivers will need to complete 40 hours of supervised driving or 30 with driver's training. If your Massachusetts driver's license has been expired for more than 2 years, you may be required to retake the road test. If you let your license expire, you may be charged a late fee and you may receive further suspension and fines if you are found driving with it. No, a Massachusetts learner's permit only allows you to drive with a qualified supervising driver - typically your parent, legal guardian, or driving instructor. Yes, as long as you're accompanied and supervised by a qualified, licensed supervisor, you can typically drive with your out-of-state learner's permit in Massachusetts with no issues. No, you will not be drug tested when you're applying for a learner's permit in Massachusetts. If you fall under the requirements of the Massachusetts GDL program, you'll need to have your learner's permit for at least 6 months before taking the road test and moving on to your provisional license. A Massachusetts learner's permit is valid for 2 years. If your learner's permit expires, you'll need to reapply. A Massachusetts learner's permit costs \$30. While you hold a learner's permit in Massachusetts, you'll need to drive while supervised by a licensed driver who is at least 21 years old and has at least 1 year of driving experience. In order to apply for a learner's permit in Massachusetts, you'll need to visit your local DMV office and: Fill out and sign an application for a new learner's permit. Provide proof of your identity, age, residency, and Social Security Number or legal presence. Provide proof of your school enrollment. Pass an eye exam or bring proof of your vision from a physician. Pass the written knowledge test. Pay the learner's permit application and testing fees. If you are younger than 18 years old, you'll typically need to be accompanied by your parent or legal guardian and their signature will need to be included on your applications. 1. Pass a written knowledge test. 5. Pay the required license fee. 6. Receive your new MA driver's license. Yes, Massachusetts does have a grace period for transferring an Out-of-State Driver's License. You have 60 days from the date that you establish residency in Massachusetts to transfer your Out-of-State Driver's License to a Massachusetts Driver's License. To transfer your Out-of-State driver's license to Massachusetts, you will need the following documents: 1. Proof of your identity, such as a birth certificate, valid passport, permanent resident card or military ID. 2. Proof of your Social Security number, such as a Social Security card, W-2 form or pay stub. 3. Proof of your Massachusetts residency, such as a recent utility bill or lease agreement. 4. Your out-of-state driver's license. 5. Payment for any applicable fees. In order to transfer an out-of-state driver's license to Massachusetts, you must: 1. Be at least 18 years old. 2. Have a valid out-of-state driver's license from the same or equivalent class of license you are seeking in Massachusetts. 3. Have held your out-of-state driver's license for at least six months prior to applying for a Massachusetts license. 4. Not have a Massachusetts license, permit, or ID that has not been expired for more than five years. 5. Pay the applicable fees and surcharges. 6. Pass all required tests, including vision, written knowledge, and driving tests (if applicable). 7. Provide proof of Massachusetts residency. 8. Provide proof of U.S. citizenship or lawful presence in the United States, and identity documents such as a U.S. passport or birth certificate and Social Security card. 9. Have your picture taken and fingerprints taken (if applicable). 10. Surrender your out-of-state driver's license before the Massachusetts license can be issued. Yes, the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles (RMV) provides several exceptions for transferring an out-of-state driver's license to Massachusetts. These include: • Active military personnel, their spouses and dependents, and retired military personnel may transfer their out-of-state license without having to take the standard Massachusetts road test. • Drivers who possess a valid driver's license from another U.S. state or Canadian province can transfer their license to a Massachusetts license without having to take the written and road tests. • Individuals who have moved to Massachusetts after living in another state or country for at least 12 months may also be eligible to transfer their valid foreign license without having to take the written or road tests. • Drivers who have recently passed a written and/or road test in another state/country may be able to transfer their out-of-state license without having to take the tests again in Massachusetts. • Drivers who possess certain professional licenses may be eligible for a reciprocal agreement that allows them to transfer their out-of-state license without taking any additional tests. • Individuals who are over the age of 18 may transfer their out-of-state license if they can successfully pass a vision test at the RMV. Yes, you will need to retake both the written and road tests in order to transfer your out-of-state driver's license to Massachusetts. No, Out-of-state driver's licenses from other countries are not accepted in Massachusetts. All drivers must obtain a Massachusetts driver's license in order to legally drive in the state. Yes, you may have to pay a fee to transfer your out-of-state driver's license to Massachusetts. The fee can vary depending on your specific situation. For example, if you are over 18 years of age and are transferring an out-of-state license that is valid for the current year, you will pay a fee of \$50.00. However, if your license has expired, then a fee of up to \$100.00 may be required. Additionally, if you are under 18 years of age, you may have to pay a fee of up to \$30.00. The process of transferring an out-of-state driver's license to Massachusetts typically takes about two weeks. All applicants must submit the necessary documents and pass the required tests before their licenses can be issued. Yes, Massachusetts offers a program called the Massachusetts Resident Permit Process that allows non-resident drivers to exchange their out-of-state driver's license for a standard Massachusetts driver's license. The process requires applicants to provide documentation of identity, residency and a valid permit from their previous state. Applicants must also pass a vision screening, written test and a road test. To replace an out-of-state driver's license with a Massachusetts driver's license, applicants must visit a Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles (RMV) branch and provide certain documents. These documents include proof of legal presence in the United States, proof of Social Security Number, proof of Massachusetts residency, and either a valid out-of-state driver's license or a certified driving record from the previous state of residence. Depending on the applicant's situation, additional documents may be required. Applicants must also pass a vision test and pay any applicable fees. Once these requirements are met, the applicant will be issued a Massachusetts driver's license. Yes, documents required to transfer an Out-of-State Driver's License to Massachusetts include a valid out-of-state driver's license, proof of Massachusetts residency, and proof of identity. Other documents may be required depending on the type of license being transferred. Yes, the minimum age requirement for transferring an out-of-state driver's license to Massachusetts is 18 years old. No, the expiration date of your out-of-state driver's license does not change when you transfer it to Massachusetts. If you are suspended in another state, then you must satisfy that state's requirements and reinstate your license before you can apply for a license in Massachusetts. To obtain one, you must apply in person at an RMV Center. Standard driver's license/ID: It is NOT a valid form of federal identification, but it can be obtained online. It can be used to prove citizenship or lawful presence in the United States, but it cannot be used to board a plane or visit federal buildings after May 3, 2033. If you're younger than 18, you must either provide a driver's education certificate or complete driver's education in Massachusetts. If you have been in the United States for less than a year, you are ineligible to transfer your driver license to Massachusetts. Receive Your Temporary License If everything goes as planned and the Registry of Motor Vehicles approves your documentation and fees, you will be able to obtain your new license. To begin, you will be given a provisional license document while the Registry creates your new card with all the necessary information. This temporary document is legal and can be used to drive around Massachusetts or as an identity credential.
